



Lightening: Dangerous, beautiful and fascinating

Summertime is the time of many thunderstorms, which often produces lightning. There are two main types of lightning; intra-cloud lightning and cloud-to-ground lightning. Cloud-to-ground lightning appears to travel from the sky downward, but the visible flash we see is actually an upward return stroke. If conditions are right, it can initiate from a tall structure.

Lightning is essentially a giant spark caused by the buildup of electrical charges within a thunderstorm cloud and the ground. Lightning seeks the path of least resistance to neutralize the electrical charge imbalance between storm clouds and the ground.

It's best to stay away from trees or other tall objects and water during a thunderstorm. Recently there have been deaths in the U.S. caused by lightning strikes.

* July 17: a 28-year-old man was struck and killed by lightning while golfing in Hamburg, New Jersey.

* July 16: A man was killed by lightning at an archery range in Ocean County, New Jersey.

* July 10: Two teenage boys were killed by lightning while on a fishing trip in Ware County,

These deaths possibly could have been avoid-

Being near water and holding metal objects while in stormy weather poses a risk to be struck by lightning. Lightning comes in many colors, shapes and sizes. The four basic types you may see during a thunderstorm are: 1) Staccato-cloud to ground, a single and very bright stroke that is very short in duration and very intense. 2) Forked-specifically cloud to ground lightning where the stroke zigzags downward in a branching forked pattern. 3) Bead-it appears to break up into a series of luminous segments resembling a string of beads. 4) Ribbon-this occurs in high wind which displaces successive return strokes causing them to appear ribbon-like.

There are also many colors of lightning: 1) Purplecaused by the interaction of lightning with atmospheric particles such as oxygen and nitrogen. 2) Pink-less common, often appears during snow storms. 3) Greencaused by the excitation of oxygen molecules, which super heats the air, causing it to appear green as the air cools. 4) Black-this is the most dangerous lightning

because it caries a lot of energy and is hard to catch on radar. Because it's preference to metal pilots call it "dark thunder in the sky."

The rarest form of a lightning strike is gigantic jets. They form when a positive strong cloud to ground strikes all the way to the ionosphere. They can only be seen from space or specialized cameras. There are two more rare forms of lightning-dark lightning and ball lightning. Dark lightning is invisible to the human eye. It is triggered by intense electrical fields within a thunderstorm, which accelerates to near the speed of light. It produces a

> energy electromagnetic radiation. It could pose a risk to pilots and airline passengers if they are in the direct path of it. Most pilots will avoid flying directly in thunderstorms.

burst of gamma rays, which are a form of high-

Ball lightning is a rare type of lightning that appears as a ball of lightning that moves slowly through the air at walking speed. Scientists are not sure what causes it.

One theory is that it is ionized particles in the air, creating a clump of ionized plasma that glows as it dissipates. Another theory is that it is microwave radiation produced by a lightning strike that becomes trapped in a plasma bubble. Whatever the cause, it could cause severe burns or an electrical shock and even death if one comes in contact with it. In 1963 a group of scientists observed ball lightning that emerged from the pilot's cabin on an Eastern Airline flight. It floated slowly down the aisle and disappeared at the rear of the aircraft. It is thought that it originated from preceding corona discharge from metallic diverted strips on the aircrafts radome, which are designed to redirect lightning strikes away from the radar antenna towards the fuselage.

Regardless of what causes it, ball lightning is a mysterious phenomenon. One ball lightning was even reported floating through a house by a lady that lives in Manitou Beach many years ago. I spoke to her about it a few years ago when nobody believed what she witnessed.

Bottom line, lightning is both fascinating and potentially dangerous. Stay away from windows, water and tall, pointed objects like trees during a thunderstorm. After all, this IS Summertime in Michigan.
