

There is no better place to be than in Michigan during the summer. We have many outdoor activities that you can enjoy - boating, skiing, kayaking, picnics, etc.

One of the easiest and most costeffective ways to enjoy Michigan's outdoors is hiking. We are blessed with countless hiking trails that you can enjoy such as the Dahlem Center (one of my favorite hiking places), MacCready Nature Reserve, Watkins Lake State Park and County Preserve, Grand River Fen Preserve, Falling Waters Park Trail, Hidden Lake Gardens and many others. Most do not require an entrance fee, with the exception of Hidden Lake Gardens. HLG's entrance fee includes the Sky Walk, which is an at-tree-level walk (65 feet above ground) that allows visitors to

experience the tree canopy like never before with up-close observation of leaves, branches, birds, insects and other woodland wildlife. It is very cool!

Besides the fact that you'll get good exercise by hiking you will witness countless beauty and discover wildflowers such as phlox or yellow lady's slippers which dot the landscape with bright colors. Sometimes while hiking you will meet new friends. Once while I was hiking with my girlfriend in Grayling, Michigan, along the Au Sable River on Mason Tract trail we came upon a group of people from Ann Arbor that were trying to build a campfire with little success. I showed them the proper technique to build a warm, glowing fire and we soon became friends. We came up with an idea to have an

annual "treasure hunt," where we would give them a map with clues to find the hidden buried booty. I found out they liked rum, so I buried a bottle of Captain Morgan Rum. One year later we met up again along the Au Sable and after tracking many clues they found the buried rum under the roots of a tree. Over the years we have put out many different items for "treasure." It was a lot of

It's a good idea to stick to the trails so you don't get lost, and avoiding the tall brush off the trail will help keep those nasty ticks off you.

So, take advantage of the many trails that we are blessed to enjoy. Bring along a friend or a relative so they can share the experience with you. Perhaps you'll get some cool pictures that you can reminisce about many years later.
