No persons are expected to be displaced as a result of the proposed activities.

The Village's Master Plan, which encompasses a housing development component, is currently in progress and will be available for review later this year. 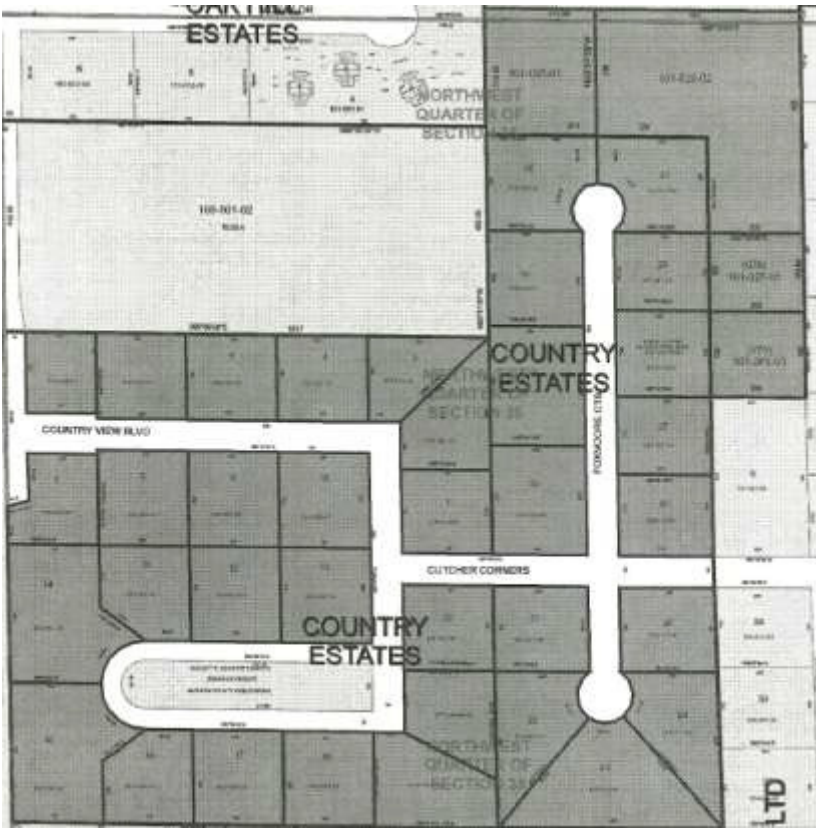
