THE DISTRICT includes all of the lots and parcels on the following roads: Almeda Court, Virginia Court, and Franklin Court.

TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to the provisions of Act 188, Public Acts of Michigan, 1954, as amended, the Township Board has received a petition signed by record owners of land constituting more than 50% of the total frontage upon the road being improved in the proposed special assessment district comprised of the lands described above, and has tentatively declared its intention to proceed with the public improvements described as follows:

Acquiring and constructing road improvements, consisting generally of mill and fill or a crush and shape on hard surfaced roads and placing Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) on existing gravel roads and related improvements, rights of way, and appurtenances and attachments thereto.

Board has tentatively declared its intention to make such improvement and tentatively designated the above-described lands as a special assessment district against which part of the cost of said public improvements is to be assessed.

Guinness record holders of fastest eaters have nothing on this hungry fella!

When we are hungry, some of us gobble down our food. My dad often did this as he did not want his food to be cold, much to the dismay of my mom.

Most of us have heard of Joey Chestnut, who holds the world record for eating the most hot



dogs and buns in 10 minutes, which is 83!

Leah Shutkever, a lady from England, holds many world records for the fastest eating of pasta, cucumbers, etc. She once ate a burrito in 32.35 seconds.

Still, there is a creature right here in Michigan that lives in our backyard, and this creature puts these records to shame. It's one that my dad used to curse at and has aggravated many people as they walk across their beautiful lawns. I am talking about the star-nosed mole.

Before we talk about its incredible speed-eating ability, here are some facts about this tunneling critter: It is not a rodent but is related to shrews and hedgehogs. It is a semi-aquatic mammal with dark brown or black fur known for its star-shaped nose and for creating volcano-like mounds in fields and in people's yards. Their nose has twenty-two pink fleshy tentacles used to feel their way underground and even underwater to detect their prey. This mole is often found near swamps or

areas where water has built up, unlike its cousin, the Eastern mole, which prefers drier soil. They are also one of the few mammals that can smell underwater! They do this by blowing out air bubbles in the water that pick-up scent particles in the water and then sucks them back up through their nose. This allows them to track prey underwater.

Their nose also picks up faint electrical signals, much like the Australian duckbill platypus. Its brain has a specific set of nerves that allows it to "brain-map." Born blind, they can "build a picture" of their surroundings, including their prey. Once it finds its prey, it has toxic saliva that neutralizes it. It is NOT dangerous to humans, however, because its venom is too weak and its fangs are at the back of its mouth.

Contrary to one's belief, they do not hibernate and can be found in our yards where water has been built up. They are active year-round, day and night, and can be a nuisance. Traps and poisonous grubs are a couple of ways to reduce their presence.

Incidentally, pushing down their mounds does nothing to deter them. These mounds act as air vents, and they will simply push them back up. The Eastern mole digs deeper and longer tunnels, and closer to the surface.

The Star-nose mole holds the Guinness World Record for the fastest-eating mammal. It can detect and eat its prey in 200 milliseconds, which is less than one-fifth of a second! I guess you could say it doesn't have the best table manners and puts Joey Chestnut and Leah Shutkever to shame.

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
