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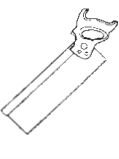

The meeting was called to order by the supervisor at 7:00 P.M. with the pledge to the flag. Roll call showed all board members present. Approved the following regular items: the agenda, the minutes of the June 10, 2026 meeting, the treasurer’s report, the payment of bills in the amount of \$169,597.15, the monthly police, fire, zoning, planning commission and ZBA reports. Approved selling the fire department hose roller for \$5,000. Approved re-advertising for the sale of the 2020 John Deere zero-turn mower at \$4,999.00. Approved special assessment districts and assessment rolls for Cambridge Drive and Lakeshore Drive. Approved following the personnel committee recommendations for the hiring of the office secretary position and the zoning officer position. Adopted Ordinances #26-002 and #26-003 regarding membrane structures. Approved the 2026 renewal of the property/casualty insurance package at a 6.6% increase from 2025. Approved allowing an additional seven days for the owner of 461 Egan Hwy. to close on the sale of that property, and allowing the new owner to have 30 days from the date of closing to submit plans and permit applications for the renovation of the property. Adopted resolutions of intent to renew the special assessment districts for Marsh/Lyster Road and Meadow Lane. Discussion on the sale of the 2019 Dodge Charger. Approved keeping the car until December 1, 2026. Public comment was received.
