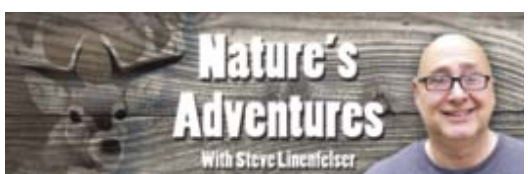

# Wild turkeys are back!

Wild turkeys have always fascinated me. When I was growing up they were a rare sight around Brooklyn. In fact, by the early 1900s, the Eastern Wild Turkey was all but extinct in Michigan due to loss of habitat and unregulated hunting. Then in the 1950s, conservation groups worked with the Department of Natural Resources and brought in turkeys from other states such as Pennsylvania. Fifty wild turkeys were purchased from Pennsylvania back in the 1950s, and by 1965 the first turkey hunting was allowed with 400 permits issued to hunters that harvested 11 turkeys. By 1969, 50 turkeys were harvested. By 1989, their numbers recovered so we'll that 6,195 were harvested by hunters during turkey hunts! Today wild turkeys exist in all counties in the Lower Peninsula and many parts of the Upper Peninsula.

Here are some fun facts about wild turkeys:

- \* Male turkeys make a gobbling sound we often hear in the Spring but both males and females make a variety of sounds such as purrs, cackles, yelps and clucks.
- \* A group of turkeys is called a "rafter."
- \* Wild turkeys are fast. They can reach speeds of up to 55 mph in flight and 25 mph on the ground.
- \* They are very intelligent with remarkable survival instincts and memory of food locations. They are capable of problem solving and have been observed using sticks as tools.
- \* They have distinguishable droppings. Male droppings are elongated or J-shaped while female droppings are spiral shaped.
- \* The fleshy growth above a turkey's beak is called a snood.
- \* Males have "beards" on their chests which are made up of horse-tail like feathers called mesofiloplumes.
- \* A jake is a juvenile male with a beard measuring 2 to 4 inches long. Tom's are males that are 2+ years old and their beards are longer-up to 12+ inches long. Jakes have short stubby spurs while a tom's spurs are longer and sharper. A tom's tail feathers are much more developed and well rounded. Often they are seen with their tail feathers fully fanned out and strutting to impress the hens.

**After disappearing from Michigan, wild turkeys have made an amazing comeback.**

Turkey licenses are available for purchase starting March 16 for anyone, so by the time you read this they are available for both public and private land. It is recommended to use a 12 gage or 20 gage shotgun, but many people have used muzzleloader rifles, bows or crossbows to hunt them. One very close friend of mine has even used a French dueling pistol to hunt them!

Ideally you want a turkey to be within 40 yards or less to achieve the best odds of harvesting them. Too far away, and you might simply wound them.

Most people will sit very still on the ground against a tree or in a pop-up ground blind. Due to their exceptional eyesight you should be well camouflaged and sit still until you are ready to shoot. I usually wait until the tom is look-

ing away before I raise my gun and shoot.

In the upcoming weeks I will be writing about a local turkey hunter who lives in Jackson County. She is AMAZING. She happens to be a world-class turkey hunter!

Even if you're not a turkey hunter you may want the challenge to go out one day and sit out in the woods while well camouflaged to see if you can spot these fascinating birds. If you sit still long enough you may get lucky enough to watch the mating process between the males and females. Due to the success of their numbers, you will probably spot the toms or jakes strutting in front of the hens in a field next to the road or other public areas.

Yes, wild turkeys are back!
