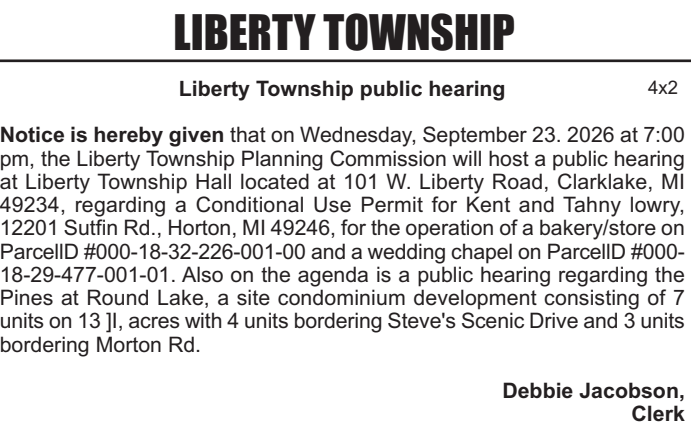

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at a Leoni Board of Trustees meeting held on August 11,2026 at 913 Fifth St. Michigan Center, MI 49254, Chapter 42-358 was adopted by a 7 Aye vote.

Sec. 42-358. Fences

(a) *Intent and Purpose.*
This Section is established to regulate the installation, placement, and maintenance of fencing on all real property within the Township. The standards herein are designed to uphold a balance between individual property rights, public safety, and the personal privacy of residents, while acknowledging the distinct geographic and aesthetic requirements of both Waterfront and Non-Waterfront Parcels.

(b) *For any district in or bordering an R-1, R-4, and RM district:*
Height and Placement Regulations
1. Fences in side or rear yard. Fences constructed within a side or rear yard shall not exceed higher than six feet as measured from the surface of the ground.
2. Waterfront Yard (Front Yard): No fence, wall, hedge, shrubs or trees shall exceed 36 inches in height within any required front yard facing the water (measured from the surface of the ground).
3. Waterfront Approved Materials: Fences in waterfront yards or side yards must be of an "open" construction to ensure visibility. Approved styles include, but are not limited to:
• Wrought iron or ornamental aluminum.
• Split-rail.
• Chain link.
4. Property Line Constraints: Fences situated along any property line of a Waterfront lot shall not exceed a maximum height of 48 inches, except as provided in the privacy exception below.

(c) *Visibility and Public Safety.*
No fence, wall, or hedge shall be installed or maintained in a manner that interferes with the visibility of motorists or pedestrians using a driveway or public roadway.

(d) *Waterfront Privacy Fencing Exceptions.* (Pre-Existing Conditions)
Notwithstanding the height limits in subsection (b), privacy fencing may be permitted under the following unique circumstances:
1. Proximity Rule: Where an existing home is located less than 15 feet from an adjacent housing structure, a privacy fence may be allowed to provide a buffer between the dwellings. This rule applies only if the home's length is at a minimum of 50 percent of the length of the adjacent home located within that 15-foot proximity.
2. Height Limit: Such privacy fencing shall not exceed a maximum height of six (6) feet.
3. Length Limitation: The length of the privacy fence shall not extend beyond the edge of the primary home structure (e.g., it may only run alongside the house and must terminate at the rear and front building lines).

(e) *Waterfront Deck Guardrail / Fencing and View Preservation*
1. General Safety Requirement.
Any deck, porch, or raised floor surface located more than 30 inches above the finished grade or floor

(below) shall be protected by a guardrail. Such guardrail shall not exceed the maximum height of 36 inches, measured vertically from the walking surface to the top of the rail.
2. View Preservation Waterfront Lots.
To maintain the scenic character and shared water views of neighboring residential waterfront properties, the following transparency standards shall apply to deck guardrail and fencing:
(a) Transparency Standard: Non-obscuring materials are required for all guardrails and fencing on decks elevated over 30 inches within a designated waterfront yard.
(f) *Permitted Non-Obscuring Materials:* Guardrails and fencing on decks elevated over 30 inches; owners shall utilize "non-obscuring" high-transparency materials. Approved materials include, but are not limited to:
• Tempered glass panels.
• Wrought iron or thin-profile metal balusters.
• Thin-profile cable railing systems.
(g) *Fences Construction:* Fences constructed of pallets, scrap wood, plywood, particle board, sheet metal, corrugated metal, plastic sheeting, tarps, fabric, construction debris, tires, or similar salvaged materials are prohibited. All fences shall be constructed of materials specifically manufactured or commonly recognized for fencing purposes and shall be maintained in good repair.
(h) *Prohibited types of fences.* No fences shall contain electric current, an electric charge or barbs.
(i) *AG districts.* Electric or barbed fences shall be permitted, except where an AG district abuts an R-1, R-2, RN and RNF residential district.
(j) *Electrical substations and gas regulator stations.* Electrical substations and/or gas regulator stations shall be provided with an enclosing fence or wall at least six feet high and adequate to obstruct the view and passage of persons or materials.
(k) *Zoning permit.* No person shall erect, install, construct, or relocate any fence upon any parcel without obtaining a Zoning Permit from the Zoning Administrator. The permit application shall be accompanied by a site plan depicting the location, height and type of fencing material to be used.
(l) *Maintenance and Repair Exemptions.* A Zoning Permit is not required for the routine maintenance or repair of a legally established fence, provided that such work is confined to the existing fence line and the original footprint. Any deviation from the established location or extent of the fence shall be considered new construction and require a permit.

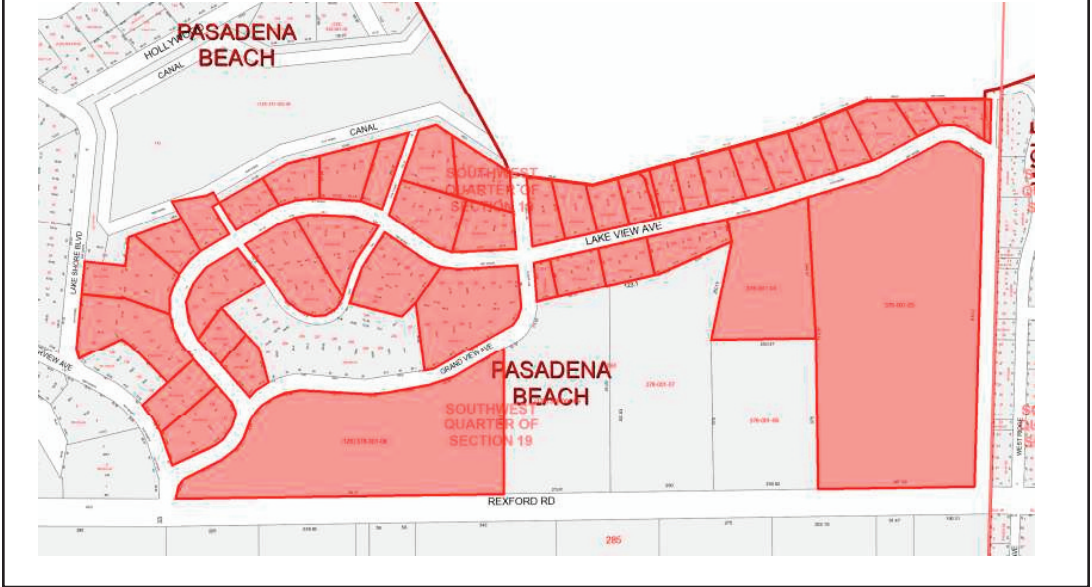
